Pastor's Perspectives

Possible Daily Mass times??? I want your feedback. We are considering changing some of our Daily Mass times to meet more people's needs. Currently we have good regular attendance at our Tuesday, 8:10 AM Mass and our Wednesday 5:30 PM Mass. However, I am open to experimenting with different times on Thursday and Friday. The movie, "*The Shack*" is very well done. I encourage you to see it. Through an engaging narrative of one man's life and unusual encounter with God, it challenges us to look deeply at sin, suffering, God's love, forgiveness and redemption. Some have criticized the movie because God refuses to stand in judgment over us. Yet, the movie's portrayal is very much in tune with Pope St. John Paul II who said "God is the infinitely good and merciful Father. . . (Hell) is not a punishment imposed externally by God." Instead of hell coming from God's judgment, "it is the state of those who definitively reject the Father's mercy, even at the last moment of life." So hell according to St. John Paul II comes from our rejecting God, not God rejecting us.

Our Lenten Penance Service will be Thursday, March 30th at 7:00 PM. We will have several priests here to help with confessions that evening. The Sacrament of Reconciliation is the opposite of Adam and Eve hiding from God. Instead we bring our sins to God, receive God's forgiveness and allow God to enter into our struggles to live out God's love.

Easter Sunday Masses will be at 7:00, 9:00 and 11:00 AM.

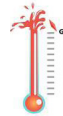

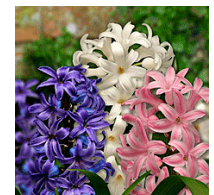
Easter will be here soon and our Worship and Gathering Spaces will be decorated with flowers celebrating this special season.
