Pastor's Perspectives

Parish culture is felt the moment you walk into a building. Yet parish culture is hard to define and more important than goals and strategy. The Pastoral Council has begun to examine our parish culture, both on the level of outward behaviors and the underlying values. Our goal is not simply to define St. Vincent's based on values such as hospitality, community, acceptance, compassion and adult-centered faith formation, but to also look at new values we need to embrace. One of the new values that surfaced was a culture of invitation. One group that is an example for us is the Walking with Purpose Women's Bible Study. Once a month they change their session and have a "connect coffee," where people are encouraged to invite new members. The study that day is adapted to be welcoming for new people that have come. Walking with Purpose has a culture of invitation built into their structure. It goes beyond saying you are welcome, to saying you are invited and wanted.

So the Pastoral Council is seeking your feedback on two items. First, what are the three or four key values that currently define St. Vincent's or should define St. Vincent's in the future? Secondly, how can every group and ministry incorporate a culture of invitation into how they function? Please send your feedback to my email at kent@svdpsk.org. The Annual Fund is coming up in a couple of weeks. This Fund allows us to maintain our buildings. To adequately maintain a commercial building, it is recommended one spend at least 2% of the replacement value of the building each year. The current replace-

ment value of our building is \$8.4 million. So 2% would be \$168,000 each year, which is close to what we receive from the Annual Fund. We try to make those dollars go farther by using some of our own labor and volunteers.

The **Annual Fund** this year needs to focus on some basic maintenance items such as replacing the south boiler; filling cracks, sealing and restriping the parking lot; exterior painting; replacing the movable wall between the Gathering and Social Space; and finally updating a number of smaller items inside the building with the help of volunteers. None of these projects is unusual based on the age of the building and the normal life cycle of parking lots, boilers, paint and movable walls.

Stewardship -In the first reading from the prophet Isaiah we get a glimpse of a model for Christian stewards to follow. Within the temple, God's voice shakes the foundations and causes the natural world to shake and tremble. The Lord asks: "Whom shall I send? Who will go for us?" Isaiah replies to the call of God for service with immediacy and enthusiasm: "Here I am, send me!" There is no hesitation. There are no excuses, contingencies, or "what-ifs." Good stewards know that responding to the Lord's call to serve is never easy, never simple to grasp, never designed for ready comfort and success. But the call needs a response. What about us? What does it take to shake us into an enthusiastic response? To say to God: "Here I am, Lord. Send me!"
