Pastor's Perspectives

Holy Week Liturgies will be Holy Thursday and Good Friday at 7 p.m. Holy Saturday Night at 8:30 p.m., and Easter Sunday at 9 and 11 a.m. We also will have Stations of the Cross on Good Friday at 3 in the afternoon. We also will have a special time of Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament in the Ville after the Holy Thursday service until about 10 p.m. You may come and go to adoration as the Spirit moves you.

The Holy Saturday Night Vigil is a half hour later than normal because Easter is so late in the year and we are not allowed to start the Vigil until it is getting close to dark. The Holy Saturday Vigil however is the great celebration of Easter in the Catholic Church. We will not have our regular Saturday evening confessions and Mass at 5 p.m. because Mass is not allowed before dark.

Come celebrate Holy Week with us, especially the services on Thursday, Friday and Saturday evenings. These three services make up the Holy Triduum and are unique liturgies. Only Holy Thursday resembles our Sunday Masses. Together, these three liturgies create a mini-retreat for those that attend. Each person walks with Jesus through the Last Supper with the washing of the feet, through Jesus' passion and death as we hear the passion and venerate the cross, and through the whole history of salvation that culminates in our celebration of Jesus' resurrection on Saturday.

During this Holy Week, consider a new way of approaching Jesus' passion, death and resurrection. I challenge

you to go a step beyond admiration to walking with Jesus as a friend, just as you would walk with a friend through an illness. If we walk with Jesus as a friend, we not only give thanks for the love we see, but we are led to feel sorrow for Jesus in his sorrow, abandonment when he is abandoned, and remain close as one would remain with a friend who is dying. This approach begins with a friendship with Jesus and leads one to a deeper union with Christ. May this week truly be one of growth in love of Christ.

Finally, invite a friend to our Holy Week and Easter liturgies.

Stewardship – “Fully Alive as Missionary Disciples”

In the prelude to today’s great Passion Narrative, Saint Paul reminds us that we find our hope in the “emptiness” and “humility” of Christ Jesus; a life that led to the cross, but through the cross, to glory and exaltation. The way is not easy. Good stewards know that it requires a willingness to lay aside all rights of personal privilege, emptying ourselves in the service of others; and embracing values different from the values of the world. It requires an understanding that to be “in Christ” means to be a servant because Christ came into the world, not as Lord but as servant. What crosses are we willing to carry? What worldly values are we willing to forego in order to share Christ’s glory?
